# WGEI Working Group

---



- The Working Group on Audit of Extractive Industries (WGEI) is a community of Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs) which shall promote the audit of extractive industries
- Chaired by SAI Uganda which also hosts the Secretariat
- Shall promote among others:
  - Experience sharing
  - Capacity building and training
  - Cooperative audits
  - Raise awareness on importance of SAIs in this sector

# Data integration

---



- Important to have data available in one place
- Will potentially lead to faster and higher quality of audit because of
  - Less time spent on combining different datasets – often done manually
  - Getting access to data and information
- It forces different government actors to cooperate and share data

# The next level : systems audit

---



- SAIs may audit the integrity of the systems by applying IT audit
  - Access control
  - Hacking
- SAIs may apply algorithms and machine learning to identify high risk areas
- Performance audit may be applied by for example comparing
  - Application for licenses and permits and approval for licenses and permits
- A formalized role of the SAI within the EITI process should take into account:
  - Mandate and role of the SAI
  - Reporting format and timing of report
  - Available resources
